2020 has been a period of challenges and great advancement. Our most significant improvement was staffing a medic unit in the fire district. We are now capable of providing advanced emergency medicine 24/7! This was made possible through a partnership with the Sauk-Suiattle Indian Tribe.

We were also able to hire a full-time training captain through a federal grant. This position coordinates the training of all personnel in Darrington and Oso.

The presence of Covid-19 has affected every aspect of our service. It has required new approaches and creativity to operate in this new environment. Thankfully our team has adapted well and has worked diligently to continue serving our community.

Darrington Fire District Earns New Rating





Earlier this year, members of Darrington Fire District 24 earned a "Water Tender Credit" through the Washington Survey and Rating Bureau (WSRB). A tender credit is applied to fire departments who show proficiency in flowing large volumes of water for an extended period of time in an area where fire hydrants are not available. This is done through an independent onsite evaluation of our training and operations by an official WSRB auditor. In addition to the insurance rating improvement, this shows that we are continually working to

provide the best level of service that we can, even in our rural areas.

This accomplishment is due to the continual efforts of our outstanding volunteers and staff.

By receiving our tender credit, there is an opportunity for home owners and renters in the non-hydrant areas to see a possible improvement in home/rental insurance premiums. Fire Chief Fenstermaker,

Washington Surveying and Rating Bureau (WSRB) has completed its evaluation of the tender operations, as they relate to fire insurance rating, of your community. It is our pleasure to inform you that Snohomish County Fire District 24 will receive WSRB Tender Credit, effective October 1, 2020.

WSRB Tender Credit will apply to dwelling properties located within 7 road miles of a responding fire station but not having a standard fire hydrant within 1,000 feet. Dwellings in your community that meet these conditions will receive a Protection Class 7 (within 5 miles) or Protection Class 9 (5 to 7 road miles), which is an improvement from the previous Protection Class 8A or 9A that applied to these properties. Protection class ratings for individual properties are available by calling WSRB customer service at (206) 217-0101. We recommend residents of your community that have a dwelling that meets the above conditions contact their insurance agents to determine the relative effect this new protection class will have on their insurance premiums.

We wish to thank you and your staff for their cooperation during the evaluation.
